5. The Class Memorial Service remains a special event at our reunions. This year we are planning to remember our departed classmates in a dignified, non-denominational service in Battell Chapel. We also have extended a warm welcome to the widows of deceased classmates, and we are expecting many of them to join us. The reunion fee and the cost of campus housing is waived for any widow who attends the reunion.

The accompanying pamphlet provides comprehensive information concerning logistics for our reunion. Here are some highlights:

Registration: You may fill out and return the form in the pamphlet; alternatively you may register for the reunion online at www.aya.yale.edu/reunions.

Costs: The cost for the full reunion is \$450 per person. However, those who register by March 31 can take advantage of our special **Early-Bird Fee of \$350**. (Paper registration forms must be postmarked March 31 or earlier.) As you will note in the pamphlet, for those who can only attend for one or two days, fees will be pro-rated on a daily basis. **Financial assistance** is available on a confidential basis for those unable to pay the full costs of the reunion. (Please contact Jennifer Julier at the AYA at 203-436-8014 or jennifer.julier@yale.edu.)

Lodging at Hotels: As of this writing, the downtown hotels are fully booked, but there is still room at La Quinta Inn on Long Wharf, which is served by the reunion shuttle. As we get closer to our gathering in New Haven, rooms at the downtown hotels may open up, so do keep trying — or ask to be put on a wait list.

Lodging in Davenport: Rooms will be available in Davenport College, our headquarters, beginning on Thursday night. You may also stay in the air-conditioned New Residence Hall near the gymnasium. You may reserve your on-campus housing when you register online or fill out the enclosed form. Lodging on Tuesday or Wednesday: Those arriving on Tuesday or Wednesday and planning to stay in a reunion hotel on the weekend should contact the hotel to extend your stay at the favorable reunion rate. Those who plan to use on-campus housing may choose to stay on Tuesday and/or Wednesday night at one of the reunion hotels. Another option is the Clarion Hotel in Hamden (203-288-3831), where we have negotiated a rate of \$109/night. You must reserve by May 13th and mention the "Class of 1964" when you call.

Entertainment: Count on convivial conversations during dinners and social events, the Bales-Gitlin dance band on Saturday night, and frequent appearances by all thirteen of the Whiffenpoofs of 1964.

We hope this packet entices you to join us in May, and we look forward to seeing all of you then!



PIERSON-SAGE PARKING GARAGE, 280 WHITNEY AVE ("Reunion Parking")

Pierson-Sage Garage is free for reunion guests and is the only Yale lot available throughout reunions. Pierson-Sage is a covered, guarded parking structure accessed via the Yale parking lot at the intersection of Whitney Avenue and Humphrey Street, just north of the Peabody Museum. As you enter from Whitney Avenue, turn right immediately; Pierson-Sage will be straight ahead. The AYA Reunion Shuttle makes regular stops at Pierson-Sage; please look for the sign near the garage entrance.

RTE 15 (WILBUR CROSS/MERRITT PKWY)

From north Take Exit 61. Drive south on Whitney Avenue for approximately 4.5 miles. At the next traffic light after the intersection with Edwards Street, turn right into the parking lot (Humphrey Street goes to your left).

From south Take Exit 57. Drive east on Route 34 (Derby Avenue) for five miles to the fork of Derby Avenue and George Street (three blocks past the Yale Athletic Fields). Bear right on George Street. Continue on George Street to York Street. Turn left on York Street and then right on Elm Street at the third light. At the fourth light, turn left on Church Street, which becomes Whitney Avenue. The parking lot is on the left one block after the Peabody Museum.

INTERSTATE 95

From north Turn off turnpike at 1-91 North Exit (Hartford, Springfield Exit) and continue for a short distance on 1-91 to Trumbull Street, Exit 3. Follow 1-91 directions below.

From south Take Exit 47, 1-91 North (Hartford, Springfield). Follow 1-91 directions below.

INTERSTATE 91

From north and south Take Exit 3 (Trumbull Street). Stay in the middle lane and continue straight through the traffic light onto Trumbull Street. At the second light turn right on Whitney Avenue. The parking lot is on the left one block after the Peabody Museum.
